Codium capitulatum Silva & Womersley

Techniques needed and plant shape









Classification

Phylum: Chlorophyta; Order: Bryopsidales; Family: Codiaceae

*Descriptive name

lobed felt-weed

Features

plants dark green, grow flat on rock, 150mm long and 10mm thick, lobed and with the consistency of felt

Special requirements



shave off a few of the microscopic outer structures (utricles). View under the microscope. Large utricles 600-1300µm long and 70-140µm in diameter, narrow utricles baton-shaped with a terminal knob or *head* characteristic of the species


Occurrences Usual Habitat

from southern W Australia to Tasmania and north to Queensland on rock in the lower intertidal and just below, in moderate to rough waters.

Similar Species

Codium lucasii. Microscopic investigation of the utricles is needed to separate the species.
